




Do you approve or disapprove of the way Kathy Hochul is handling her job as Governor of New York?


Do you think Kathy Hochul has performed her job as Governor well enough to deserve re-election or do you think it's time to give a new person a chance?

Hochul's reelect score further highlights her inherent vulnerability as only a quarter would opt to reelect her as Governor; 63% say it's time to give someone else a chance.








Comparison of 'Favorable' Ratings Overall Respondents vs. Republican & Ind Respondents


What is your opinion of Elise Stefanik?


What is your opinion of Mike Lawler?








If the 2026 election for Governor were held today between these candidates, who would you vote for?




